Trauma-Informed Care

Understanding trauma-informed practice is key to creating a safe and supportive environment for young people. Our work involves recognizing the impact of trauma, responding with empathy and understanding, and fostering resilience through positive relationships and empowerment. Access to technology is not just a luxury, it's a necessity.

Our commitment to bridging the digital divide can be seen across all our Clubs - 42% of our population struggles to access WiFi outside of our programs.

Overcoming Language Barriers

52% of students who attend our service schools do not speak English at home - most speak Spanish.

Our amazing bilingual staff help us build positive relationships with all families, regardless of primary language.





Inspired Youth Spotlight

When 7-year-old Liam first joined our program two years ago, his struggles with regulating his emotions led to disruptions in school and Club programs. Instances of fighting left him isolated from his peers, and his lack of engagement in program activities raised concerns.

Recognizing the urgency of the situation, our social work team sprang into action. Liam and his family were provided with comprehensive support services, including counseling, therapeutic group sessions, social emotional learning lessons, and mentorship with a compassionate adult. Our team also collaborated with Liam's family, empowering them to enhance their advocacy skills. As a result of their efforts, Liam was successfully placed in a school that is equipped to support his academic and emotional growth.

With these supports Liam is thriving, has continued to make new friends, and shares his enthusiasm for program activities. In January 2024 Liam's dedication and positive influence were recognized as he was named Student of the Month within his program group, a moment celebrated with immense pride by our entire team.




MILESTONES

2020-2023 has been some of our most impactful - and challenging - years yet, marked by key milestones that brought us closer to assuring success is within reach of every young person in the communities we serve.




INCREDIBLE YOUTH OUTCOMES


